




The Vatican has released a 50-page reflection on the importance of the vocation of religious brothers, and their life and mission. Archbishop Rodriguez said the document is meant to highlight "the richness and necessity of all the vocations in the church, especially the vocation of lay religious life for men and women." The document itself says that "the vocation of the Brother is part of the answer that God gives to the absence of brotherhood which is wounding the world today".
