PLAN for the Anglo-Irish Province 2018 – 2023

Identity and Mission

"The Chapter affirms that, as Brothers, we wish to witness to an authentic understanding of the role as men and as disciples in today's world and Church." (Chapter Statement 2017)

The Province Leadership Team (PLT) of the Anglo-Irish Province, as followers of Jesus Christ under the patronage of Mary of the Presentation and inspired by the charism of Blessed Edmund Rice, adopts the Chapter example and encourages the Brothers of the Province to bear witness by being authentic to our <u>Mission</u> to 'form Christ in the young'.

The thrust of the Anglo-Irish Province has always had a strong focus on developing the Christian faith of young people. The ministry of the Brothers has changed from the tradition of being teachers / administrators in schools to being innovators in spreading the Gospel through Presentation Brothers Youth Ministry (PBYM). PBYM began on 07 August 2013. It is now the core ministry for the Anglo-Irish Province.

Our <u>Identity</u> has changed over the years from being Brothers of one nationality within the Province to being Brothers of different nationalities – we are now a multi-national / multi-cultural Province. We are 'men living in community together, sharing faith' (Chapter Statement 2017) and '...the gifts we have received from the Father through the Holy Spirit...in good times and bad...we aspire to be men of prayer...(As vowed religious), we fully dedicate ourselves to the service of God and of our neighbour...We accept the Gospel as the supreme norm and condition of our lives...a journey in faith and an adventure in hope...The Blessed Virgin Mary helps us to deepen that faith and strengthen that hope...the Patron of our Institute and the inspiration of our Presentation way of life'. (Cons. 4, 5, 7)

- Transform Mardyke House into the PBYM Centre.
- Renovate Mardyke House.
- Have a Community of at least two Brothers residing at Mardyke House and involved with Youth Ministry.
- Appoint an additional full-time person in Youth Ministry.
- Continue with the Advisory Board while regularly recruiting new members.
- Review PBYM annually through an independent body.

Community

Action Plan:

- Commit to 'listening with our hearts' to all Brothers residing in the Province.
- Embrace the 'new' within our Communities viz. the multi-cultural dimension of our Province.

Care of the Elderly

- Upgrade the facilities at Maiville.
- Review the Care Pathway Guidance Plan.
- Appoint an additional Province Healthcare Coordinator.
- Appoint an additional Care Assistant at Maiville.
- Review the overall situation regarding the Brothers in Dartford including the feasibility of 6 The Brent as a Community House.

Leadership

Other activities lead by the Province Leadership Team

1. Vocation Ministry

- Supporting the role of the Vocations Director.
- Encouraging the Brothers to continue to pray for vocations.
- Recommending that the Vocations Team continues and that new members are appointed when necessary.

2. Child Safeguarding

- The PLT continues with the services of Mr Phil Mortell and Ms Eileen Campling as our Designated Liaison Officers in Ireland and the United Kingdom, respectively.
- The PLT will organise a Safeguarding Training Day (in January 2020) for Community Reps and those involved in our ministries.

- Until further notice the Province Leader is responsible for the Garda Vetting of all concerned.
- The Province Leader collaborates (in Ireland) with the National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church in Ireland (NBSCCCI), Tusla and An Garda Síochána and (in the United Kingdom) with Law Enforcement in all matters relating to Safeguarding.

3. Presentation Family

CLT Update, 19 February 2018:

"Presentation Family:

Our intention is to set up a commission to see how the Presentation family can be developed in all units of the Congregation. After a number of meetings on this, however, we have decided that we would seek the wisdom of all of you on this matter before we proceed with the setting up of the commission. We will, therefore, lead a discussion on this during our visitations of communities in May, June & July 2018. In the meantime, we welcome ideas and suggestions on this matter from some or all of you."

4. Finance

CLT Update, 19 February 2018:

"Stewardship: Congregation Resources/Stewardship Committee:

At the April 2017 Chapter, the stewardship commission presented their plan for the future stewardship of our Congregation's resources to Chapter delegates recommending that the delegates mandate the CLT "to implement the plan for the future stewardship of resources". This, the delegates did. We have therefore, started the process of implementing this plan. We are seeking legal and professional advice and will soon be in a position to inform you of further developments."
